

**TERRORISM (UNITED NATIONS MEASURES) ORDER 2006 (S.I. 2006/2657)**

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**GENERAL NOTICE OF AN ARTICLE 4 DIRECTION**

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1. The United Nations Security Council adopted resolution 1373 (2001) on 28 September 2001. The United Kingdom gives effect to paragraph 1(c) and (d) of that resolution by the Terrorism (United Nations Measures) Order 2006 (SI 2006/2657) (“the Order”), made under section 1 of the United Nations Act 1946 (c. 45).
2. This notice is to publicise generally a direction given by the Treasury on 20 April 2007 under Article 4 of the Order relating to the person identified in the annex to this notice (“the designated person”). The direction has effect until further notice.
3. By virtue of the direction, the prohibitions in Articles 7 and 8 of the Order apply in respect of the designated person.
  - Article 7 prohibits any dealing with the funds or economic resources belonging to, owned or held by the designated person, any person owned or controlled, directly or indirectly by the designated person or any person acting on behalf or at the direction of the designated person.
  - Article 8 prohibits the making of funds, economic resources or financial services available to or for the benefit of the designated person.

“Funds”, “economic resources” and “financial services” have the meanings given by Article 2 of the Order.
4. Contravention of a prohibition in the Order is a criminal offence.
5. The Treasury has power to exempt an act from the prohibitions in Articles 7 and 8 of the Order. Any person who wishes to apply to the Treasury for a licence authorising an exemption from the prohibitions should apply in writing to HM Treasury, Financial Sanctions Unit, 1 Horse Guards Road, London SW1A 2HQ, fax number 020 7270 5430. The application should clearly set out the grounds on which the licence is sought and provide full details and evidence (e.g. utility bills) in support.
6. A designated person or any other person affected by the direction who wishes to contest the direction should contact HM Treasury, Financial Sanctions Unit, 1 Horse Guards Road, London SW1A 2HQ, fax number 020 7270 5430. If dissatisfied with the Treasury’s response, the person concerned may under Article 5(4) of the Order apply to the High Court or, in Scotland, the Court of Session, to have the direction set aside.
