Haynes was a Manufacturer of, and a Wholesale dealer in forged Bank Motes at Bristol. Fra! Kingdon Town Clerk of Great Torrington, John bock, Constable and Win Simmonds, Butcher, had considerable merit in the detection and apprehension of Samuel Johns convicted in Devonshire. Thomas Raye an accomplice of Mary prince, Ionathan Forbes and James Clarkson convicted at the Old Bailey at the last and present Sessions, having disclosed all the proceedings and connections of himself and the Convicts, Submits his claim to some leward.
