absence of the Committee as the said Letter

Sir,

I have Submitted to the  
Governors and Directors of the Bank  
Your Letter to me of the 28<sup>th</sup> Instant,  
and the Petitions to the King in  
favor of Wm. Weightman and John  
Neve lately convicted at Litchfield  
for uttering forged Bank Notes, and I  
am directed to inform you that when  
the Cases of those Convicts were first  
taken into Consideration, it appeared  
to the Governors and Directors that the  
Offences were such as called upon them,  
in Discharge of their Duty to the Public  
to prosecute Capitally and nothing  
has since occurred to induce a more  
favorable Opinion of either Case, and

The Committee proceeded on the Examination of the said Bill, and determined on the following Report to be made to the Court on Thursday next. - viz<sup>t</sup>.

Report on Mess<sup>rs</sup> Winter & Kaye's Bill. That having examined Mess<sup>rs</sup> Winter & Kaye's Bill for Law Charges from Michaelmas Term 1809 to the 19<sup>th</sup> April last, which was referred by the Court of Directors, of the 26<sup>th</sup> Ult<sup>o</sup>. The Comm<sup>ee</sup> have to observe, that £33. 4. 6 has been paid on account of the proceedings respecting the Will of Thomas Robinson, and the Sum of £91. 6. 6 received for Costs



(costs, but which suit as far as the Bank is concerned is now closed.

That John Stowe Sandie under Confinement in Newgate remains in a State of Mental derangement, and no charge respecting him is in the present Bill.

That the Sum of £1051.3.0 has been advanced to Mr. Kaye (not included in the Bill) at the recommendation of the Committee, to be distributed as Rewards, &c.<sup>d</sup> amongst the persons, who have been the means of detecting and apprehending the several prisoners, who have been Tried and Convicted of Uttering forged Bank Notes or for having such Notes in their possession.

The Committee recommend that the Sum of £6,869.12.3 be paid to Messrs Winter & Kaye, being the Balance of their Bill amounting to £7,319.19.1 for Law Charges; but in respect to the Blank which is left for their Extraordinary trouble in the course of the last two Years in Conducting the prosecutions against 98 persons for Forgery, The Committee submit the same to the determination of the Court, and beg leave to state that the following Sums have been given them on former occasions. - viz.

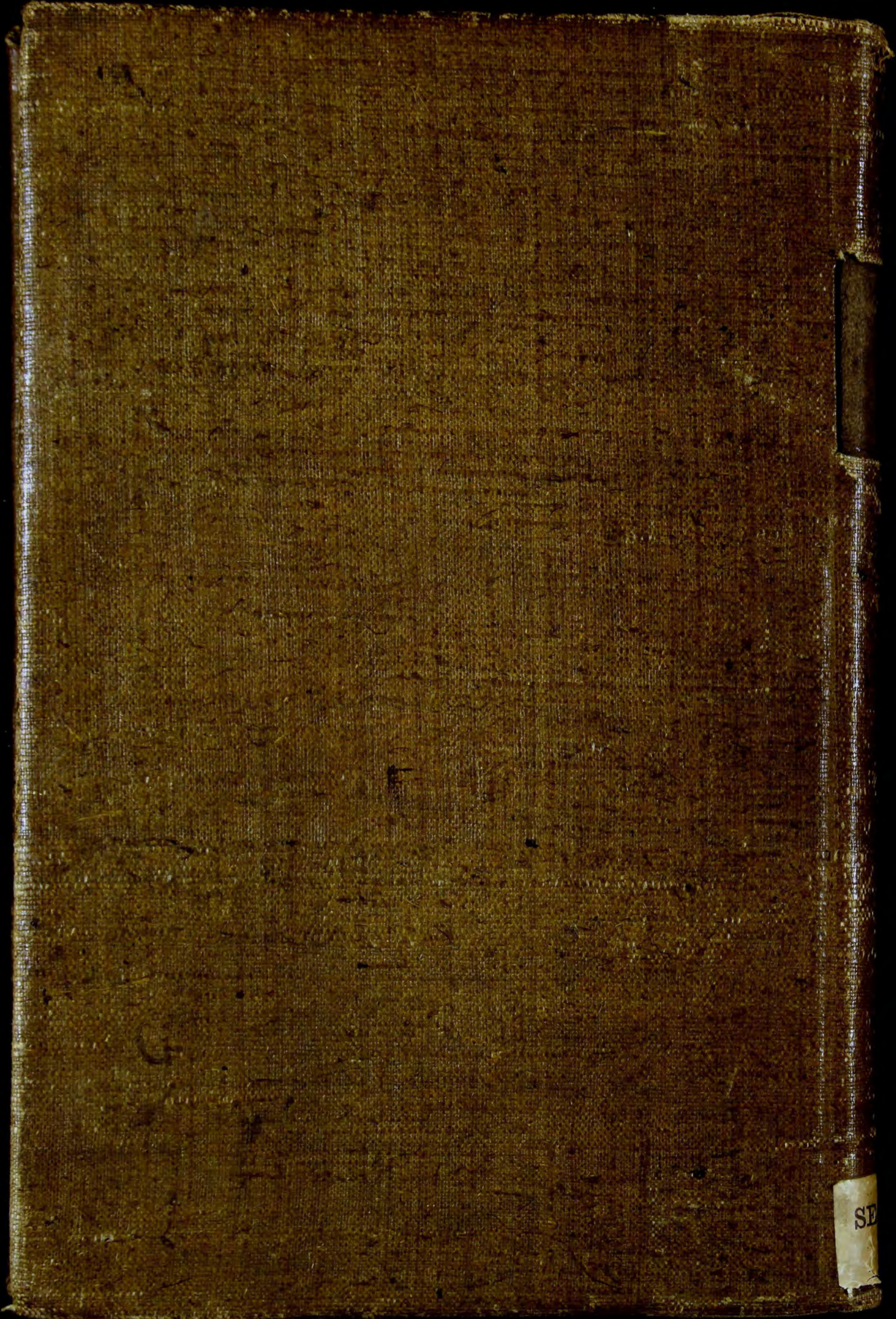
