Solicitors and Creditors of William Lane of Gutter Lane, Cheapside, Silk Manufacturer, stating that in consequence of the refusal of the Bank to accede to the arrangements, agreed to by his other Creditors, to accept of a composition of 11^s in the Pound, on account of his privity to the fraudulent Drawing of two Bills, for £440..10.. - and £436..10.. - by Robert Rose, upon and accepted by Major Blundell & Co., purporting to be drawn at Glasgow, when in fact they were drawn in London by Rob^t Rose who is only a servant in the employ of Wigglesworth & Co. - Some of his principal Creditors have met to investigate the circumstances, and it appeared to them, that W^m Lane and Mess^{rs} Wigglesworth & Co. had been largely

largely concerned in fair Business, the latter became indebted £5000 to the former, and having promised at the Date of the Said Bills, to give good Bills for £700 which Mr. Lane relied on, - but, being disappointed and much Straightened, he was obligated to receive the said Bills. - A Letter was also read from the three Creditors who were the Inspectors of the Said Estate stating their Satisfaction of the report made to them by the Accountant, and that they had always found Mr. Lane a person of the Strictest integrity, and hoped the Bank would not withhold their Concurrence to the arrangements agreed to, by all his other Creditors. -

 "as to them, that he has respecting the
 "others. - The signature of Joseph
 "Reynolds as an Indorser upon the
 "Bill for £900 is clearly a forgery, and
 "Barry & Wilkinson being perfectly
 "acquainted with his Handwriting
 "must have been aware of it when they
 "Indorsed and sent that Bill into the

"Acceptor of a Bill must be Cognizant of
"the Signature of the Drawer. - Mr.
"Barry was the party accepting and
"Indorsing these Bills, and the Circums-
"warrant a strong Suspicion that he must
"have been apprized of the Bills containing
"fictitious Signatures at the time he
"Negotiated them. - In the Case of
"Joseph Reynolds he must have had
"positive knowledge that the Signature
"was forged. -

"Mr Kaye wrote to Barry & Wilkinson
"on the 8th Instant requesting them to lay
"before him the Statement of their Affairs
"and the Plan of liquidation they had
"to
