This appears calculated to promote preferences, as any Creditors who chuse to sue Muller & Thies will very probably by this means get paid in full. - And should the Inspectors not be able to indemnify themselves out of the Estate, the Creditors Covenant Separately to Indemnify them, so that if the Bank becomes a party to this Deed, it may have to pay an indefinite Sum without regard to what it may have received. - It is Stipulated that as soon as 5^l in the pound is paid and the residue of the Effects assigned to the Inspectors, Muller & Thies are to be released. - If 5^l shall not be paid within 9 Months, Muller & Thies shall then Assign the Outstanding Effects to the Inspectors, and they are to be released, whether any Dividend shall have been paid or not. - There are some other minor objections to the Deed, which Mr. Kaye considered as unnecessary to enumerate. -
