That in consequence of the large Amount of the Bills for Law Charges in 1820, and the rapid increase of the Law Charge,

Expenses, the Court desired the Committee for Law Suits to Order an Analysis of the Bills to be laid before it, together with any observations or alterations in the System of Charge which might appear to the Committee likely to reduce these Bills in future; —

The Committee therefore beg leave to State, That the Charge for Drawing Briefs Indictments & other Business for the Year 1820, was — £16,282 .. 8 .. 7
 Do. for the Solicitors Personal attend^{ce} .. 10,140 .. 4 .. 4
 Do. for Money advanced by them — 29,757 .. 1 .. 5

The above Sum does not include what has been paid to the Solicitors to distribute amongst Sundry Persons as Rewards for their Services in detecting and apprehending the Prisoners Tried, which amounted to £525 .. 10 .. 0, nor the Investigators Monthly Charges for their Expenses &c. which Amount to £3007 .. 12 .. 7 for the Year, — thus the whole Amount is £66,331 .. 5 .. 1 —

Out. —

Out of the first Charge of £16,282.8.7 for Drawing Briefs &c.^d a considerable part is presumed to be profit to the Solicitors, - as for Drawing Briefs alone the sum charged is £8,829.2.2; and for Indictments £2370.6.10, the rest is for other Business with the different Courts. -

The 2nd Sum of £10,140.4.4 is for the Solicitor's personal attendance on the Governors, the Committees &c.^d - It seems unnecessary to enter into the Minute particulars of this Charge as the enormous aggregate if divided by the actual Number of Days of attendance in the Year, makes such a sum for each Day, as at once points out the necessity of some alteration; - if the Plan adopted at the Treasury and other Public Boards of allowing a Stipulated Salary to the Solicitor should be thought advisable, The Committee suggest that any agreement or regulation on this Head had better be postponed until the effect of any improvement in the Note, or taking the One Pound Notes out of circulation is tried; - this would probably reduce the Law Expenses to less than one tenth of the present amount, as out of 411 prosecutions of last Year, only 49 were for £5 Notes and

and upwards. -

The 3rd Sum of £ 29,757 .. 1 .. 5 for Money advanced includes as follows, Viz. £ 4,300 .. 19 .. 3 for the Travelling Expenses of the Solicitor, his Clerk, an Investigator of Forged Notes, and the several Witnesses attending the Trials, - £ 16,734 .. 17 .. 8 for Sundry Sums paid for Fees to the Officers of the Courts, for Consultations, Retainers, Subpoenas, Agents Charges, &c.^o - and £ 8,723 .. 3 .. 6 for the Fees given to the Counsel with the Briefs. -

The whole Number of Prosecutions last Year was 411, the Average Charge for each £ 149 .. 15 .. 3, although the greater Number of the Criminals were allowed to plead guilty to the Minor Offences; thus out of the 411 committed in the last Year, 251 pleaded Guilty; 140 in London, 111 in the Country; - and notwithstanding the Scale of Expense is nearly the same that has been established for some time at the Bank, The Committee wish particularly to draw the attention of the Court to that part which respects Briefs, Fees to Counsel, and the Number of Counsel employed. -

The Bank Cases are almost all Criminal, founded upon recent Acts of Parliament which cannot create great legal difficulty, or call for the Talent, or exertions of many eminent Lawyers: and although

although it is proper that Men of Talents and Character should be employed when the Bank Try Causes, nearly three fourths of the Cases are not brought to Trial, - by the Bank consenting to let the Criminals plead Guilty to the Minor Offence from the time of their Committal: - it is therefore suggested that by previous arrangement, the Expense of Briefs and Counsel's Fees in these Cases - might be (if not entirely saved) greatly diminished: at an Old Bailey Trial the Charge for Fees to Counsel is £44..1..0, and for Drawing Briefs £51, making together £95..1..0; - and the Average Charge for Briefs and Counsel's Fees in each Case for all the Prisoners committed at the Suit of the Bank, whether they pleaded Guilty or not was £35..1..11 in the last Year. -

The Fees at the Country Assizes are sometimes more, particularly on the Home Circuit where four Counsel are appointed, besides the Standing Counsel, who has always a Fee in every Case, equal to that of the leading Counsel who conducts the Cause, although it is obvious that he cannot attend on sometimes cases are Trying for the Bank at all the Six Circuits on the same Day; - The Comm^{ee}.

Submit

Submit that this is a most exorbitant way of remunerating the standing Counsel for the Bank, if at all necessary; and it must be observed that this Fee occasions the Charge of an additional Brief also, which by reference to the Sum they cost last Year, is an Expense well worthy saving.

The Committee Submit a Comparative Statement of the Bill for last Year with that for 1806, - *Viz.*

Thus exclusive of Criminal Prosecutions, the Bill of 1820 was £ 2,814..1..5 of which £ 801..11..10 was received back for costs of Suits, leaving a Balance of £ 2,012..9..7, and in the Year 1806, the Balance exclusive of the Charge for 10 Criminal Prosecutions was only £ 1,374..14..10. - This Shews the large proportion of the Charge which is occasioned by the Criminal Prosecutions, and the Comm^{ee} have thought it right to point to the leading Features of these enormous Bills. - *Viz.*

The Sum Charged for Personal attendance; the Expense of the Briefs; - and the Sum given for the Fees to the Counsel, - particularly in the Cases, in which the Criminals are allowed to plead Guilty: Conceiving that if unfortunately Prosecutions were to Continue in any thing like the Proportion of the Number of last Year

year, the Expense of Conducting them might be most materially reduced. —
