Meds the shfuld Jurther Said that the Prisoner Clemmett was considered the largest dealer in Lancashire and the result of these convictions would be, the breaking up of a gang of utterers and dealers in forged Notes upon a very eatendive Scale: and that whom the whole, Mess. Freshfield again stated, a saving had been effected in the mode adopted for bringing these Parties to punishment. to The Committee adjourned to Theesday the 1th December at The Committee adjaurn half hast two o'clock.
