Wm Robinson
Parker's Propo-
sition

That William Robinson
Parker is willing to give a
Mortgage upon his Estate in
Wells and has signed an en-
gagement which amounts to
an equitable Mortgage but he
now refuses to execute a
Mortgage of any of his Ships
upon the ground that as the
Mortgage must appear upon
the Ship's Register it will in-
jure his credit at the Ports where
he trades particularly at Hamburg
from whence he imports large
quantities of Oil Cake.

The Debt due from him
to the Bank for which Security
is offered consists of three Bills
on him, 2 drawn by Chapman
for £500. and £415. and one by
Toa for £200. Chapman's Estate
is expected to realize $\frac{1}{2}$ in the
pound in which case the claim
of the Bank on these three Bills
would

would be reduced to £900. - Besides these Bills there are three Notes or Bills not yet due deposited by Mr. Parker in the hands of Mr. Mellden for securing £220. which he states will be paid when due and he asks for time only on the Bills for £1115. -

The Property he proposes to Mortgage is situate on the Quay and in the most eligible part of the Town for Business and the Buildings are for the most part new - It consists of his own Residence with Stables &c. a Ship Building Yard with Foreman's House a Rope Walk 12 substantial Flint Built and tiled Cottages or Tenements and $10\frac{1}{2}$ Acres of Copyhold Land - The Ship Building Yard Rope Walk and Cottages are let at Rents amounting altogether to £148. per Annum, but the House Out-buildings and Land are occupied by Mr. Parker himself and he estimates them altogether at £80. per Annum, which from all the enquiry Mess^{rs} Freshfield's Clerk could make, appeared not too high - This would make the Property worth near £4000. and it is mortgaged for £2000. but there
