

The major part of this sum of \$10.000will, it is expected, be eventually recovered from the Caseto, in Custralia, of Clarke Groing, deceased, which are stated to be fully Equal to all the claims he left unsatisfied. The Estate however is administered in Chancery, and it may be two years before a final lettlement is arrived at
