In all Cases where Setters of Attorney one Attituefree by Persons interested in the Subject; either as . 

Members of the Corporation - In such Cases the Officers of the Bank have thought the Letter of attorney objectionable as being attested by a Person forming a part of that Corporation; and as such an interested, and consequently in Law not a Credible Wilness, within the meaning of the Act of Parliament For instance the Banks of Scotlans and other Corporations have sent forcers of Altoney for the sale of Stock attested by Directors, and have considered the objections made to such Towers as imporper.
