In august, 1843 on the application of William Winter Executor of one Surah Sythebee, the Bank invested \$ 600, the amount of \$600 Bank Notes alleged to have been the property of Sarah Sythehee and stolen from her, in the purchase of \$634,1.8 Consols.

It appeared that the Notes were paid to her at the Bank for Devidends on her Stock during her lifetime in the intervals between 1827 & 1832 and it was also alleged that they were stolen from her by the parties about her on her death and in consequence of family disputes were destroyed.

The Hotes are dated from 1827 to 1831 and all Sythebee Dieg in 1833 The Motes have not been forthcoming once her death, now IT years ago, and the probability of their destruction is very
