With reference to the of Section of the Bank act, 1892, which gave frower to Her Majesty to grant, and to the Bank to accept, a Supplemental Charter regulating the internal affairs of the Bank, and provided that certain enachments relating to the said internal affairs and described in a Schedule to the act should be repealed to the excent mentioned therein;

The annual subscription had been reduced in 1881 and again in 1886; but the position of the Fund having recently been submitted to the consideration of the actuary of the Bank Provident Society he had estimated that there was a deficiency in the existing assurances, assuming a 3 per cent rate of interest of £ 1042. The Fund had however been established and been worked hitherto on a 4 per cent rate, and on that basis the deficiency would probably be about £900 only.
