The Governor laid before the Committee an actimate of the profits of the Bank for the half - year ending the 28 th February . He explained to the Committee that this estimate included the sterling propit derived from the repayment of the Goed Advance made to the Austrian Government. This profit after allowing for the appropriate deduction on account of Income Lax amounted approximately to at 1,100,000 and this sum had already been, placed to Contingencies Account and would not be included in the estimates to be given by him to the Court to-morrow. apart from this portaitous projet the estimated projet for the half-year, after providing for Income Lax, Taxation Reserve and a dividend of 6% less Income Vax, was \$,510,000 and he proposed that the whole of this sum should be applied towards the first payment in respect of the proposed Superannuation Fund should the Court agree to- morrow to the creation of such a fund.




