With reference to Minutes of the 1st January 1964 and carter, the Deputy Governor acquainted the Committee of revised proposals for the Mechanisation of Dividend Preparation and stock registers in the Accountant's Department. The cost of the existing equipment authorised from time to time by the Committee was approximately \$490,000: the installation was mainly based on the 1ET 1301 computer now obsolescent, and would need very expensive alterations. The Chief Accountant reported that a more advanced series of computers recently introduced - the 127 1900 - offered many advantages in cost and efficiency, and he therefore recommended that an order be placed at once for two new machines and the existing equipment be sold back to the company as soon as possible: allowing for rebate on the old machines, the net cost of the new installation would be about £420,000, which compared with are estimated cost of £650,000 for adapting the old installation to meet present requirements.

Mr. Selwyn had recently been appointed an Adviser with the special task of studying the use of computers in the Bank as a whole, and it was possible that his recommendations might open the way to a more economical use of these expensive machines. On the other hand, the Chief Accountant could only obtain the new computers in reasonable time if he placed an order at once; but by submitting to a penalty of about \$24,000, the order could be cancelled at any time up to the 1st Tune next, and the Governors proposed to authorise the Chief Accountant to proceed on that understanding. The Governor acquainted the Committee that the London Clearing Banks' April figures, to be published on Friday morning (the 30th April) would show an increase in advances to customens other than nationalised bodies amounting to £73 million a considerable increase in net deposits and an average liquidsty ratio of 29.5%. A modest decrease in the total of advances might ordinarily be expected in April, and because there was no sign yet of the restriction of credit that had been asked for, some curt was now necessary. He proposed, therefore to recommend to the Court of the following day that a call for Special Deposits be made, equivalent to 1% of total gross deposits in the case of the hondon Clearing Banks, and to £% in the case of the Scottish Banks.

After discussion, the Sovemor proposed that he should represent to the Prime Minister the Bank's grave view of the situation: that the measures proposed by Ministers appeared insufficient to bring about a reflux of funds, and that further borrowing could not safely be undertaken.
