

TABLE XVI. The NUMBER and VALUE of FORGED BANK NOTES presented at the BANK, and the NUMBER and COST of the PROSECUTIONS for FORGERY.

This Table extends over the period since 1806, and affords very conclusive evidence that the issue of Notes for very small amounts is a great incentive to forgery.

During the time—from 1809 to 1821—when there was a large issue of £1 and £2 Notes, the forgeries presented at the Bank yearly were counted by tens of thousands, and the cost of the prosecutions for forgery was in proportion; thus—in 1820, 29,083 Notes of the value of only £33,682 were presented, and the sum of £53,785 was spent in prosecutions; whereas, in 1822, when the issue of £1 and £2 Notes had ceased, the number of forgeries presented fell to 3,642, and the cost of the prosecutions to £3,873.

Of late years, with the exception of 1884, the *new* forgeries have been few in number, and the cost of prosecutions has been merely nominal.
