

Other forecasters' expectations

May 2017

Every three months, the Bank asks a sample of external forecasters for their latest economic projections. The key findings of the Bank's latest Survey of External Forecasters, conducted during April, are summarised on page 42 of the May 2017 *Inflation Report*. The tables in this document contain the average of external forecasters' central expectations, and distributions, for CPI inflation, GDP growth, the LFS unemployment rate, Bank Rate, the stock of purchased gilts and the stock of purchased corporate bonds. They also contain the average of external forecasters' expectations for the sterling exchange rate.

This document contains five tables:
