"I cannot, however, emphasise too strongly the danger which I think there would be "if the handing over of any specific amount "of past or future "toxcess Profits" was aimed at. "Nothing should be done which could be said "to be merely a colourable method of carrying out what from the legal point of view is impossible.

"Of the legal position, you may wish me to "lobtain Counsel's Opinion. If so, I can do this "immediately.
