The Committee had before them the case of Charles A.S. Carter, a 2 no Class Clerk in the India Office, who is 4 g years of age and will have completed 30 years service on the 19th April.

Carter has suffered from eye troubles for some years, and in March 1919 his condition was such that the specialist he then consulted was of apinion that his only hope of avording total blindness lay in relinguishing his work at the Bank in this opinion the Bank Medical Officer concurred.

Carter was then granted twelve months' sick leave on full pay, and informed that he would be pensioned at the eschiration of that period.

It was agreed to recommend to the Court that Carter be granted, during pleasure, a pension, Calculated on the basis of 30 years service of £164:19: - a year, in accordance with the scale.
