#### "Rules and Orders for Clerks.

"No. 1. Clerks, on completion of two years' satisfactory service as Probationers, are eligible for election to the Permanent Staff of the Bank as Assistants. As such they will be reported upon periodically as to their work and conduct by the Principals of the Offices in which they have been employed and "unless these Reports are in all respects "satisfactory they will not be retained in "the Service. All appointments are subject to three months' notice in writing on either "side.

Permanent Service must find security for "£ 1,000 by an annual payment to the Clerks' Guarantee Fund within the Bank, "until he attains the age of 21 when he will be made free of the Clerks' Guarantee "Fund by a single payment, and must "enter into a personal Bond. On election "every Clerk must insure his life in the Bank Provident Society for a minimum sum of £200. On marriage or on election if "already married every Clerk must insure for "his Widow and Children a reversionary
