The Court desire to point out that the Cleaning Banks have, in addition to their work immediate responsibilities to depositors and other clients, duties and responsibilities towards the trade and industry of the country in general. For these they are equipped by a tradition and experience which have justly won por Brutish banking the complete confidence of the world But in the openion of the bount this very pact carries with it its own obligations and they consider that such Banks, having already supplemently onerous liabilities at home, will be wise not to assume in addition the risks and uncertainties inseparable from business
