parts. In my opinion the Deed is one which it  
is proper for the Bank of England to seal and as  
appears hereafter it is necessary and in order  
that it should be sealed now. I would add  
that in addition to the signatures of three  
Directors and the Secretary of the Bank of  
England there should be an additional witness  
who will be required to make an affidavit  
before a Notary Public as to the execution - this  
will be necessary for the purpose of registering  
the document on the Newfoundland Property  
Register.

"In sending you the Deed of Release  
I take the opportunity to inform you of the

The Newfoundland Power and Paper Company Limited has issued 90000 Preferred Shares and 50000 Ordinary Shares and has loan capital outstanding as follows:-

- (a) £1,000,000 at 1% over Bank Rate varying minimum 5% per annum collateralized secured on £1,000,000 6% First Mortgage Debenture Stock and guaranteed as to principal and interest by Sir W.G. Armstrong, Whitworth and Company Limited.
- (b) £2,000,000 4½% A Mortgage Debenture Stock guaranteed by His Majesty's Treasury.
- (c) £2,000,000 5½% B Mortgage Debenture Stock guaranteed by the Newfoundland Government.
- (d) £2,054,653 15*q* due to the Bank of England referred to above.
- (e) \$6,500,000 6% Income Bonds issued to Sir W.G. Armstrong, Whitworth and Company Limited.

There are also (1) \$285,000 due for unpaid instalments of the purchase prices of lands and timber limits (2) advances by the Bank of Montreal secured on wood pulp and other floating assets and (3) unsecured liabilities generally.

In September last the International Paper Company of New York concluded a firm Agreement to purchase the undertaking

and assets of the Newfoundland Power and Paper Company Limited (through the medium of a subsidiary limited company to be incorporated in Newfoundland) subject to the above-mentioned liabilities excepting, (a) a possible liability to Bowater Paper Company Incorporated in respect of a contract for the sale of newsprint made between that Company and the Newfoundland Export and Shipping Company Limited (a Newfoundland Company and a subsidiary of the Newfoundland Power and Paper Company Limited) (b) any liabilities there might be for certain royalties payable to the Newfoundland Government and the Reid Newfoundland Company Limited (c) interest on the £20541 653 15<sup>d</sup> owing to the Bank of England after 1<sup>st</sup> July 1927 and (d) generally speaking, all liabilities undisclosed on the 28<sup>th</sup> February 1927.

The subsidiary Company has been formed with a nominal capital of £5000000 of which £2580000 will be issued (excepting £18 already issued for cash) in shares of £1 each. The Articles of Association of this Company have been approved by me. These Articles provide for one of the Directors to be nominated by His Majesty's Treasury and for two of the Directors to be nominated by the Newfoundland Government, and, by an understanding which has been come to between the International Paper Company of New York and the Bank of England, the latter will, in effect, nominate a fourth Director. Should a quotation on the London Stock Exchange be required in respect of the Preference Shares to be issued to the nominees of the Bank of

England as mentioned hereafter. Certain alterations will be required to meet the views of the London Stock Exchange. An undertaking will be obtained from the new Company that all facilities, including alterations to the Articles of Association, will be afforded to the Bank of England to enable a quotation to be obtained.

Practically the whole of the issued Share Capital of the Newfoundland Power and Paper Company Limited will be transferred to the new Company or to its nominees together with the shares held by that Company in the Newfoundland Export and Shipping Company Limited and in the Newfoundland Power and Paper Utilities Corporation Limited - this means that the Ordinary and Preference Shares formerly held by Sir W.G. Armstrong Whitworth and Company Limited which are now vested in Newfoundland Investments and Securities Limited will be transferred to the new Company or to its nominees, leaving the Holding Company devoid of assets. Understand this Holding Company will be dissolved and instructions from the Bank of England and Sir W.G. Armstrong Whitworth and Company Limited to this effect will have to be given to the Royal Trust Company who have been acting as the Agents of the Bank of England in connection with the management of the "Holding Company".

The £1000000 owing to the Bank of England will be discharged either by the substitution of £1000000 5½% First

Mortgage Bonds of the new Company or by the  
payment of cash.

If new bonds are issued they will be taken by the Bank of England as an investment. Such new bonds will form part of a total authorised issue of £4000.000 nominal of such bonds, the remaining £3000000 to be issued in blocks or series whenever the Company may think fit either in Sterling, or in Dollar currencies of the United States of America, Canada or Newfoundland at the rate of 4.8665 to the Pound Sterling with or without power to exchange; the rates of interest in each series may vary but in no case will the maximum interest rate of any series exceed 7% per annum gross; the security will be a first fixed mortgage on all the existing mill and power properties of the Company (including timber limits and water rights) and other fixed assets now existing, and hereafter to be acquired out of the proceeds of new portion of the £3000.000 nominal of bonds as shall be issued for the purpose of purchasing fixed assets, and also a first floating charge on all other present and future assets of the Company subject always to a power in the Company to raise or leave upon mortgage any portion of the purchase price of any assets fixed or otherwise. The purposes for which any portion of the £3000000 may be raised have apparently been the subject matter of careful consideration by the advisers of His Majesty's Treasury and the Newfoundland Government and are set out not only in the Trust Deed which will secure the First Mortgage Debenture Bonds, "And in an Agreement concluded between International Power and Paper Co. of Newfoundland Ltd., and

the Newfoundland Government and which has legislative force, but in the documents relating to the necessary modification of the rights of the A and the B Debenture Stockholders. Shortly put, such purposes are as follows:—

1. additional working capital - proceeds of not more than £200000 nominal of bonds for each paper machine installed by the Company additional to those now installed at the Corner Brook Mill.
2. the acquisition of additional fixed assets (including timber limits) free of mortgage.
3. the construction of or additions to buildings, plant, structures or other works of the Company.
4. for repurchasing issues already in existence at the time of repurchasing.

This latter provision applies to the total £4000000 and all bonds redeemed may be re-issued from time to time for any of the before-mentioned purposes. Provision is also made in the Trust Deed to ensure that should there be default in the obligations of the new Company in any one or more of the issues of bonds either as to payment of principal or interest or otherwise, such default will be equivalent to default on the whole; this is to eliminate the possibility of any one series being put into a different or preferential position as to the other series. Also it is provided that

"no series shall be issued having a maturity earlier than that of the £1000000 of bonds to be issued to the Bank of England - such maturity is not yet definitely determined. If the £1000000 is issued to the Bank of England it will be redeemable by the operation of an accumulative sinking fund and at any time at the option of the Company prior to maturity.

Should it be decided by the new Company to pay £1000000 in cash to the Bank of England, I understand it is the intention of the International Paper Company of New York that the new Company shall raise the money by the issue of £1000000 of Bonds in New York but this will not be effected until some date later than the date on which the sale and purchase takes place. I have considered this position and my opinion is that the Bank of England will run no risk of loss of security in agreeing to this. I will arrange (a) that the existing security of the First Mortgage Debenture Stock held as collateral security for the Bank of England's loan of £1000000 shall not be released until the amount plus current interest to date is paid (b) that the existing guarantee of Sir W.G. Armstrong Whitworth and Company Limited shall be replaced by one of the International Paper Company of New York (c) that the International Paper Company of New York shall undertake to complete the issue and secure the payment of the necessary principal and interest within two months after the date of the completion of the sale and purchase and (d) that the payment or transmission of these moneys shall be at the direction of the Bank of England.

"The rights of the "A" and the "B" Stockholders will be modified in that the First Mortgage Bonds of the New Company shall have priority of security, the maturity date of the A Stock will, as regards His Majesty's Treasury as Guarantors only, be extended to 1973, the maturity date of the B Stock will, as regards the Stockholders and the Newfoundland Government as Guarantors be extended to 1970 and the Sinking Funds of both Stocks will be altered so as to lighten the burden during the years of commencement of the Funds. The B Stock will be redeemable at a premium of 5% which will not be covered by the Guarantee of the Newfoundland Government.

Mectings of the Stockholders to approve the modifications will be held on the 29<sup>th</sup> instant and I am told that the proxies already in hand in favour of the proposals are sufficient in both cases to ensure the passing of the necessary Resolutions.

The £ 2 054.653 : 15 : 9 will be paid off or satisfied on the completion of the sale and purchase as to £ 500000 in cash and as to the balance by the issue in the names of Messrs. Mahon and Walker of 2000000 £ 1 fully paid 5% Preferred Shares of the new Company which will have cumulative dividend rights after five years from issue. Voting rights will only arise in the event of dividends being two years in arrear so that no voting rights can attach during the first seven years, and then the voting rights on the Common Shares will

be sufficient to enable the holders of them to retain control. The £500,000 in cash will be the price of issue of 500,000 Common Shares of £1 each to the International Paper Company of New York or its nominees. It is in respect of this particular transaction that the Deed of Release accompanying this letter is required. Subsequently to sealing by the Bank of England the Deed will be sent to Sir W.G. Armstrong Whitworth and Company Limited for sealing by that Company and then returned to me for sealing by yourself and Mr. R.C. Stevenson; it will then be sent to and held by the Bank of Montreal as the Agents of the Bank of England for transmission with other necessary documents to St. Johns, Newfoundland "for delivery there as against payment of cash and allotment of Preference Shares - there will be no payment of interest."

The Income Bonds held by Sir W.G. Armstrong Whitworth and Company Limited will be cancelled without payment but among other considerations that Company will receive the benefit of the cancellation of their guarantee to the Bank of England in respect of £2054653 : 15 : 9.

I am told by the Representatives of the International Paper Company of New York now in London that an understanding is being come to with the Bank of Montreal regarding the money due to that Bank. I have no details and I think that it is not necessary that I should be satisfied on this point.

I am also told by these Representatives that there is every possibility of a satisfactory arrangement

arrangement being come to between International Paper Company of New York and Bowater Paper Company Incorporated which will eliminate altogether any risk of the latter Company making a claim in regard to the termination of its contract with the Newfoundland Export and Shipping Company Limited. Even assuming this were not to be the case I am satisfied after reading the cases put to Counsel and their Opinions on the question of liability, that no legal claim exists as against Newfoundland Paper and Paper Company Limited.

I am also told by these Representatives that so far as they can see no claim can be substantiated in respect of royalties by Reid Newfoundland Limited. I think this is correct and I am satisfied on the information before me that no claim on this ground can affect the validity of the sale and purchase and the issue of shares and the payments of cash and/or the issue of bonds to the Bank of England.

An Agreement has been reached with the Newfoundland Government whereby a tax on the income of the new Company beginning with the year 1928 and ending with the year 1973 will be paid at the rate of 20% of such income as therein defined with a maximum in respect of each of the years 1928-1931 of \$75,000 and for each of the years 1932-1973 (inclusive) of \$150,000. This tax replaces the royalties formerly payable to the Newfoundland Government.

I would add in conclusion that it is hoped that the sale and purchase will be completed on or before the 15<sup>th</sup> January on which date interest becomes due to the holders of the "A" and "B" Debenture Stocks. If it is not some arrangement will no doubt be made by the International Paper Company of New York to put the Newfoundland Paper and Paper Company limited in funds to meet these payments. The same remark applies equally to the payment of interest becoming due the 1<sup>st</sup> January previous in respect of the £1000000 due to the Bank of England.
