At the end of August the total of loans outstanding, including those approved but not yet taken up, was rather more than f3 million: a summary of the loans is given in Appendix B. This compares with £2/4 million in 1953. It was estimated then that the total would rise in the next 20 years to a peak little short of £5 million and this estimate still holds good. At that time the Committee said " these are formidable figures but the alternative would mean a grave increase in the Staffs housing problems: and considered the Scheme to be essential if the Staff were to be adequately housed. After fully reviewing the position, they still regard the scheme as essential and recommend that it be continued and be reviewed again in September

From time to time loans have been granted to members of the Staff about to "retire to enable them to buy houses to "live in dwring retirement, repayment "being made on retirement.
