"That, since the introduction of the 1958 Salary "Scheme, the Big Fire banks have twice increased basic salaries "by approximately 5%. It the time of the second increase (in "July 1960) the Court approved the payment to the bank Staff of "a pensionable supplement of 5% of annual salaries or wages.

"banks had, on the second occasion, increased salaries in the "published scales by about 5%, at the higher levels larger increases "had been given. After considering the views expressed by the Council "of Directors and Staff at their meeting last November, the Committee "of Treasury agreed that there was a case for widening the "differentials, within the framework of the 1958 Classification, by "increases of about 8% at the lower end of the scale rising to about "15% at the top and that scales on that basis be submitted to the "Staff Committee.

Preservation of Pension Rights That in recent years increasing numbers of employers have introduced deferred pension provisions for those leaving pensionable employment before the normal retirement age. All the Big Five banks except the Midland (who have yet to announce their decision) have declared in favour of preservation of pension rights, apparently because competition for suitable staff is now so keen that they cannot afford to lag behind. In general, the same considerations apply to the Bank, particularly as regards recruitment of women.

The subject was first raised by the Elected
Members of the Council of Directors and Staff
in 1957 and subsequently during discussion of the
"State Graduated Pension Scheme which itself requires
"a measure of preservation of pension rights. With the
approval of the Committee of Treasury, outline
"proposals have already been discussed informally
"with the Council of Directors and Staff and the
