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# TRANSCRIPT

This is a transcript of the inventory that was taken of the Bacolet and Chemin sugar plantations in Grenada by the Bank of England in 1788 (reproduction above).

It lists the names, role and perceived value of each person enslaved on the plantations. It also lists buildings and equipment. The original document is in the Bank of England Archive.

Anything in red or within square brackets shows additions that are not included in the original text. A '[?]' symbol indicates a word that is indecipherable in the original handwriting.

Be aware that all values in this inventory are not in pounds sterling, but in local Grenada money currency. There will be a difference in the exchange rate.
