Ahead of the presentation you might find it useful to complete some of the activities below. These are optional, but may provoke some interesting questions and discussions ahead of the presentation.

Pre-presentation resources:

'Pounds and pence' - a set of four YouTube video modules

1. What is money and how does it work? (2 minutes; suitable for KS2 students)
An introduction to the concept of money and security features on banknotes.

What can you do with money? (2.5 minutes; suitable for KS2 students)

This module highlights the importance of interest rates and how they affect people who borrow and save money.

- 2. What is money worth? (2.5 minutes; suitable for some KS2 and KS3 students) This module explains what inflation is, and what causes prices to rise.
- 3. Who controls the value of money? (2.5 minutes; suitable for some KS2 and KS3 students)
 This module covers the role of the Bank of England, and how interest rates affect inflation.
