Overview

Purpose

In this form, a CCP should include all of the particulars required for the Bank to assess its mobilisation application.

A CCP should complete the Permissions application section if it intends to apply for a Permission under s.138BA of FSMA as modified and applied by paragraph 10(1)(ba) or paragraph 10A(c) of Schedule 17A of FSMA 2000.
