
Bank of England's holdings of gold and foreign exchange, 1924-31

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An article on the origins and development of the Exchange Equalisation Account, which appeared in the December 1968 issue of the Bank's *Quarterly Bulletin*, included figures of official gold and currency reserves from 1932 onwards. This leaflet gives approximate figures of the Bank's holdings of such assets during the preceding seven years from the end of 1924 to the end of 1931, and so spans the inter-war period during which the United Kingdom was on the gold standard (from the end of April 1925-September 1931).

The figures of gold holdings are those of the Issue Department; some comparatively small holdings by the Banking Department are not included because, from the records available, they cannot readily be separated from holdings of silver. Gold is valued as in the Bank Returns at the time, at the Bank's selling price of 77s.  $10\frac{1}{2}d$ . per standard ounce (equivalent to 85s. per fine ounce). This method of valuation differs from that used in the E.E.A. article where, from mid-1932 to mid-1939, gold was valued at market prices. The difference in valuation largely explains why the figures of holdings in mid-1932 given in the earlier article were so much larger than those now quoted for the end of 1931.

The figures of foreign exchange include only U.S. dollars and French francs and so may not represent a complete record of the Bank's holdings in the years shown. However, holdings of other currencies were very much smaller, and movements in them unimportant. U.S. dollars and French francs were converted to sterling throughout at the parities ruling up to September 1931 ( $\pounds 1 = U.S. \$4\cdot86656$  and French francs 124·2134).
